ADMINISTRATION UPHOLDS HIGH STANDARDS



Supervising Mt. Lebanon's nine schools, Dr. Ralph Horsman, Superintendent, acts as a liaison between the school system and the school board.

Through a combination of effort and leadership, the administration maintains Mount Lebanon High School's high educational standards. These administrators create an atmosphere conducive to excellence by offering skilled guidance to students and faculty, by planning a comprehensive curriculum, and by coordinating school functions. 
N.F.L. DEVELOPS POISE AND LOGIC




































The Mounty track team ran through another successful season in 1963, winning all but one of their nine dual and triangular meets and placing first in three championship tournaments. The single loss to Penn Hills ended a 140 meet winning streak which began in 1944. This series of wins is the longest string of victories in the nation's history of track.

Tom Giordano, described by Mr. Mollenauer as "the best distance runner in our school's history," broke the school mile record twice and received national ranking for his 4:20.6 mile. Dev Lemster brought home the W.P.I.A.L. championship in pole vaulting. A sure winner in 1964 is Dennis Larabee, whose 1963 discus throw of 173' 7" broke another school record.














