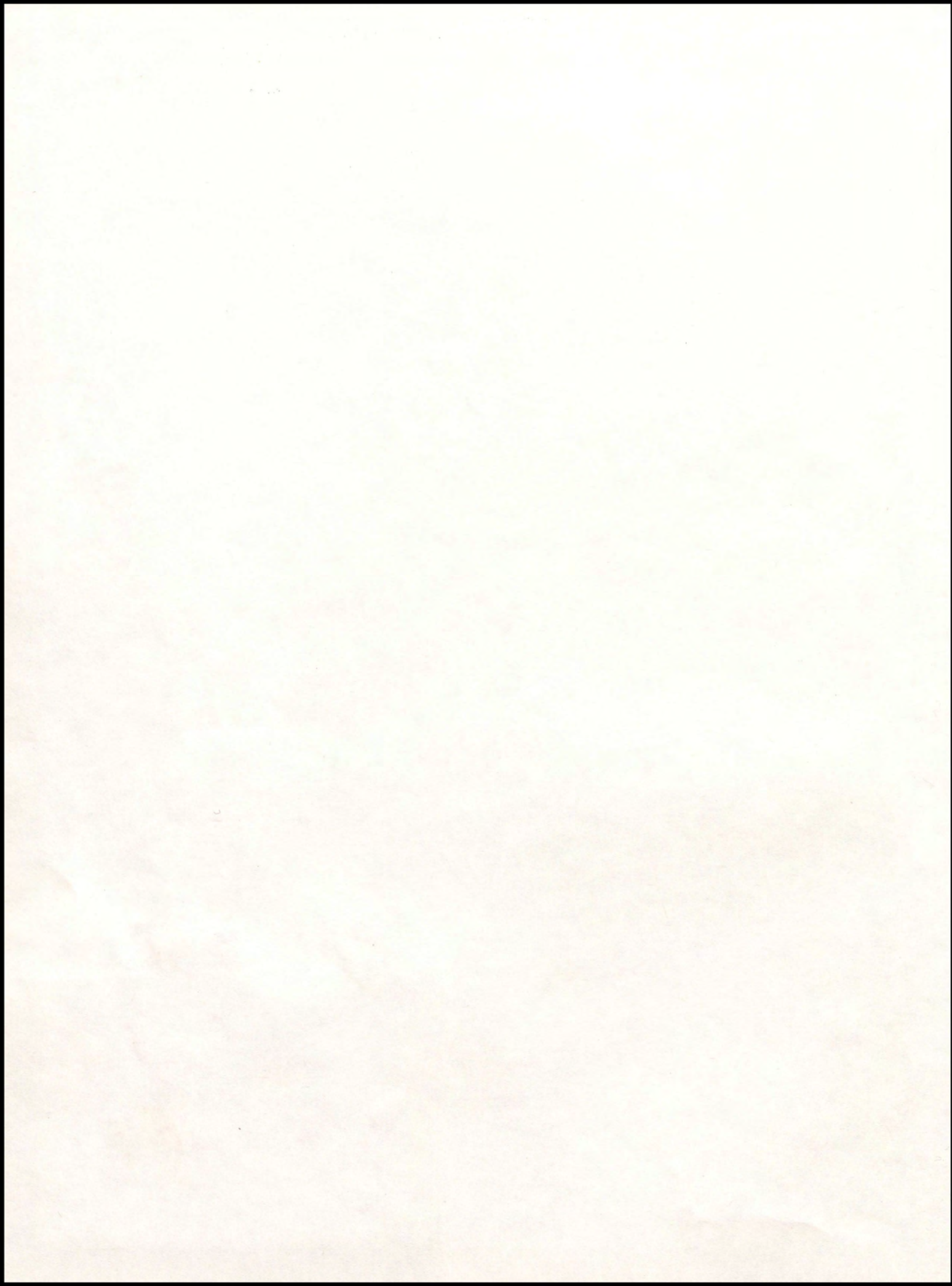
Our reporters journeyed to the faculty lounge, the teachers' carrels, and even Mr. Graf's office. There too, we met blank faces.

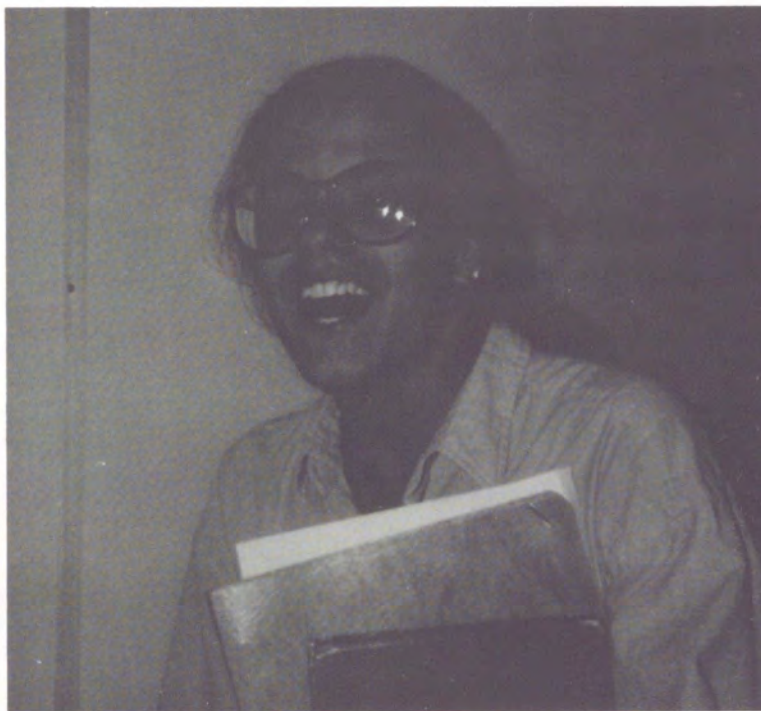

"HOW TO ACT IF YOU DO NOT WANT TO BE CALLED ON:"

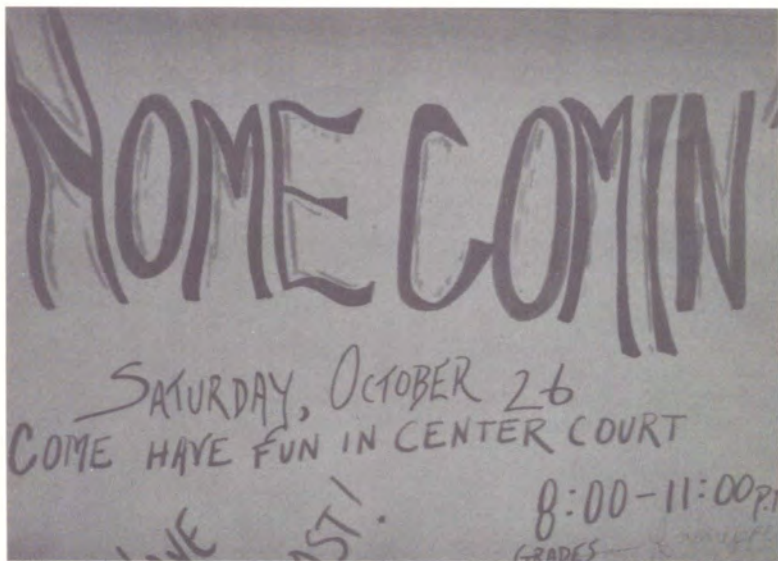

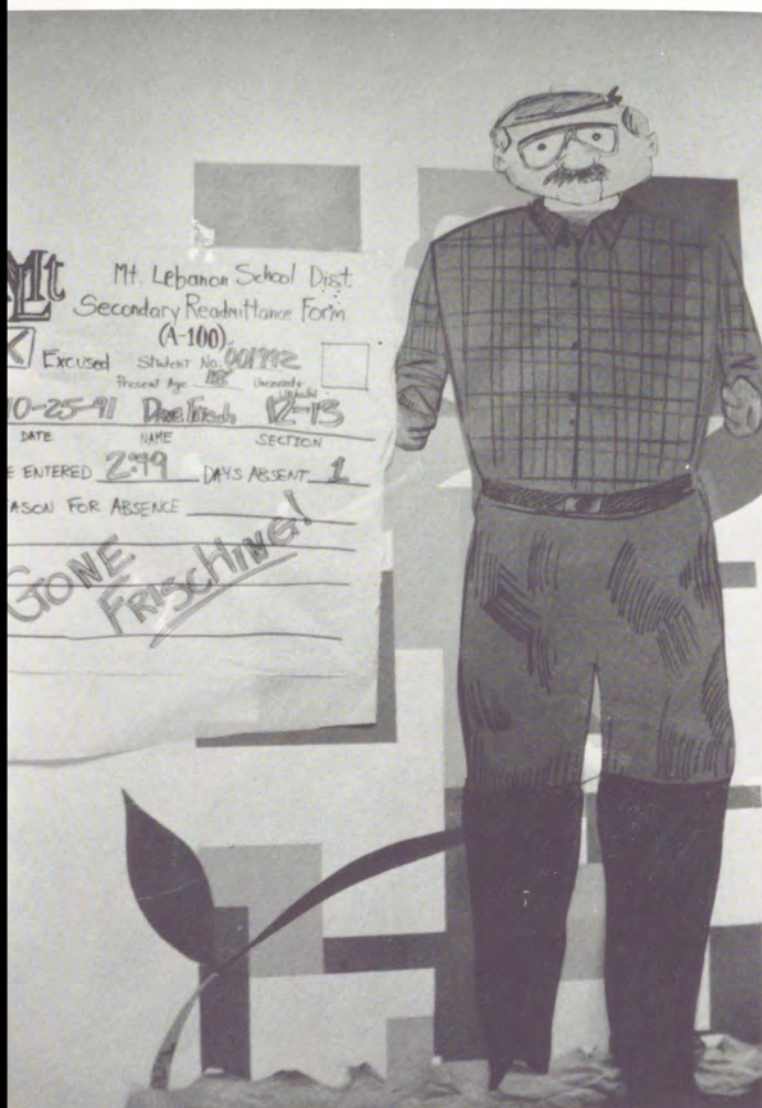

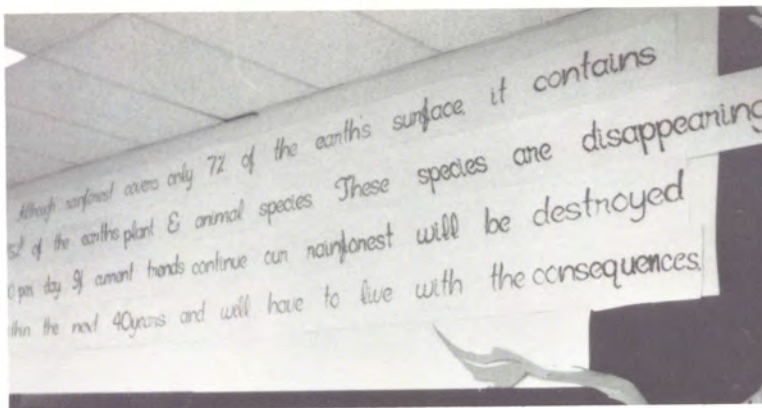

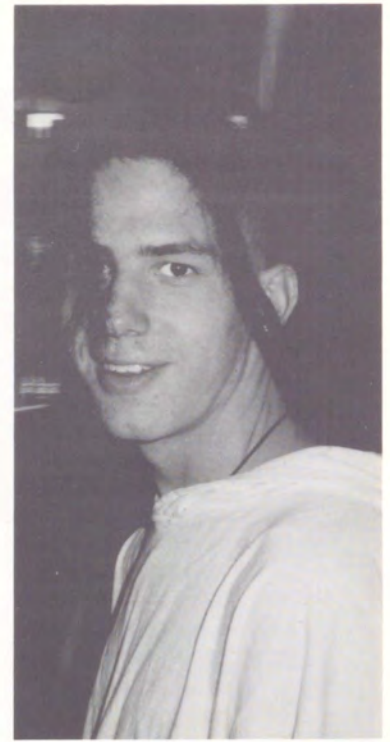

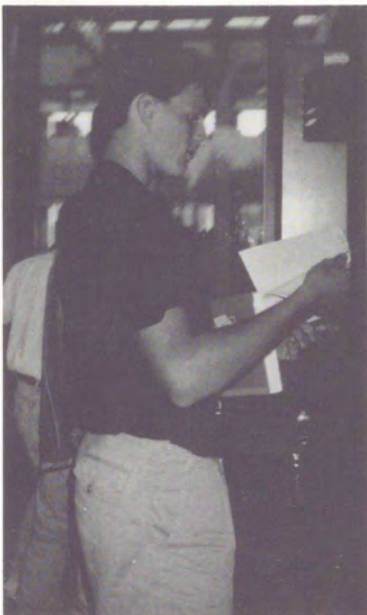

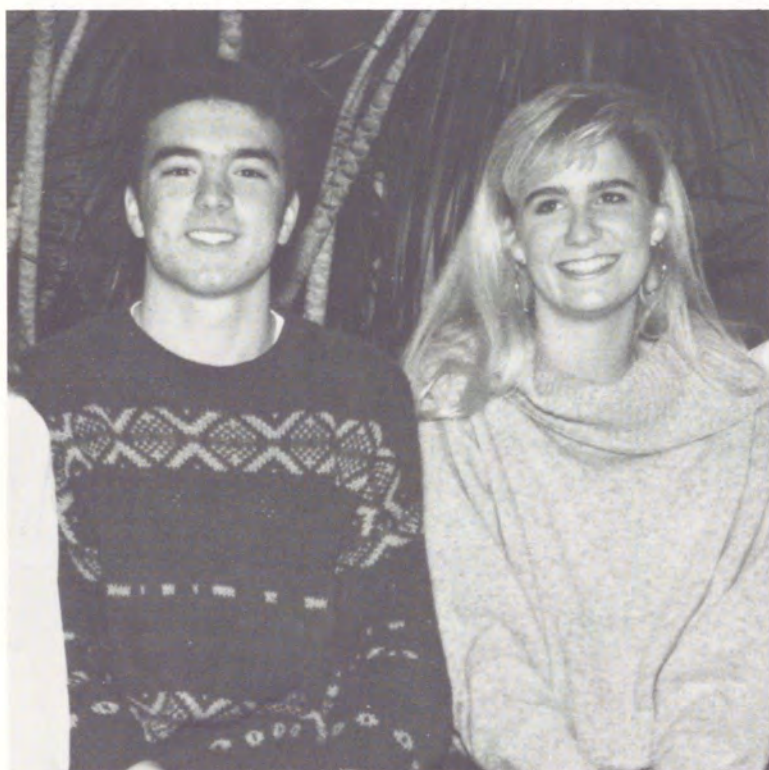

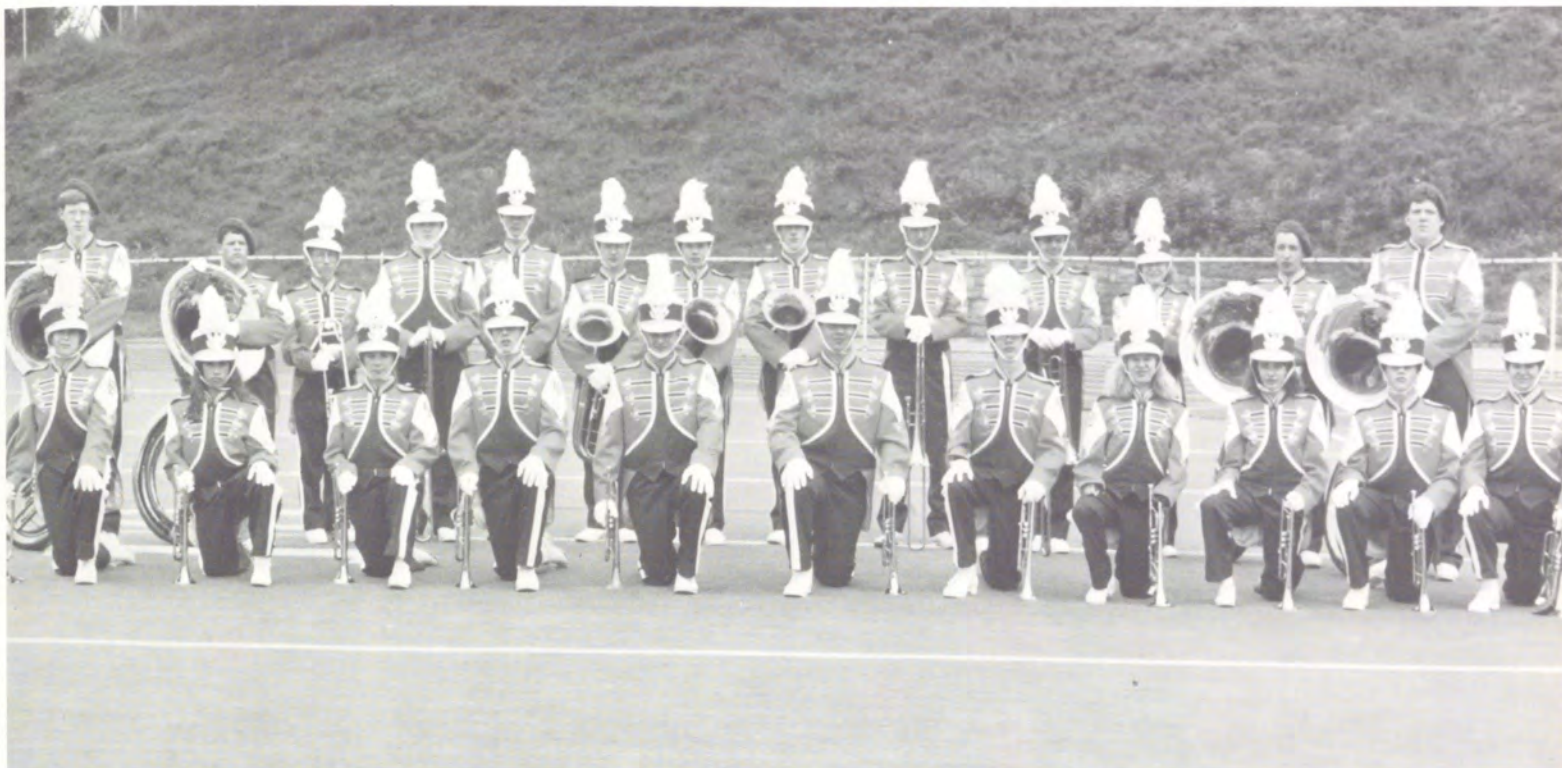

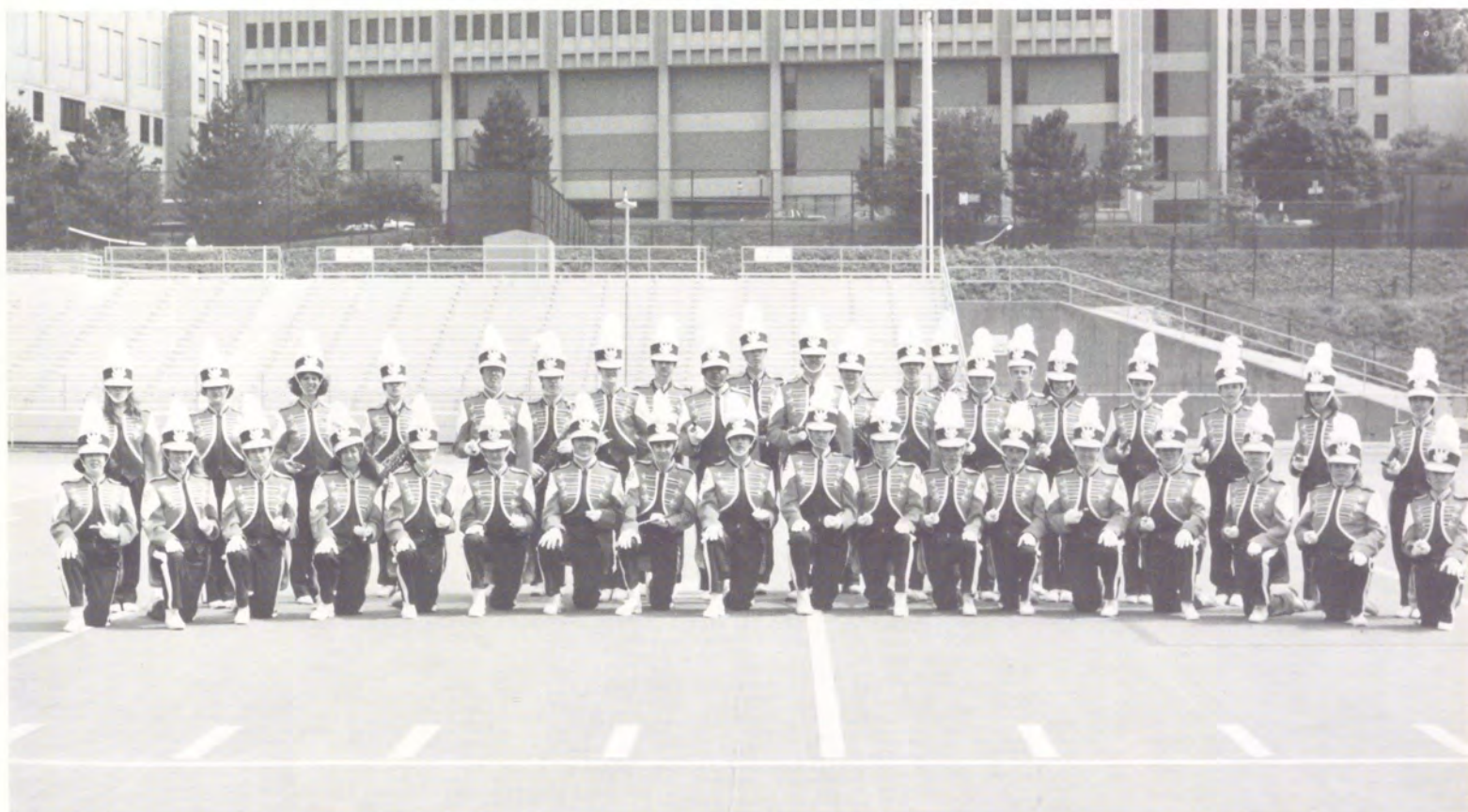

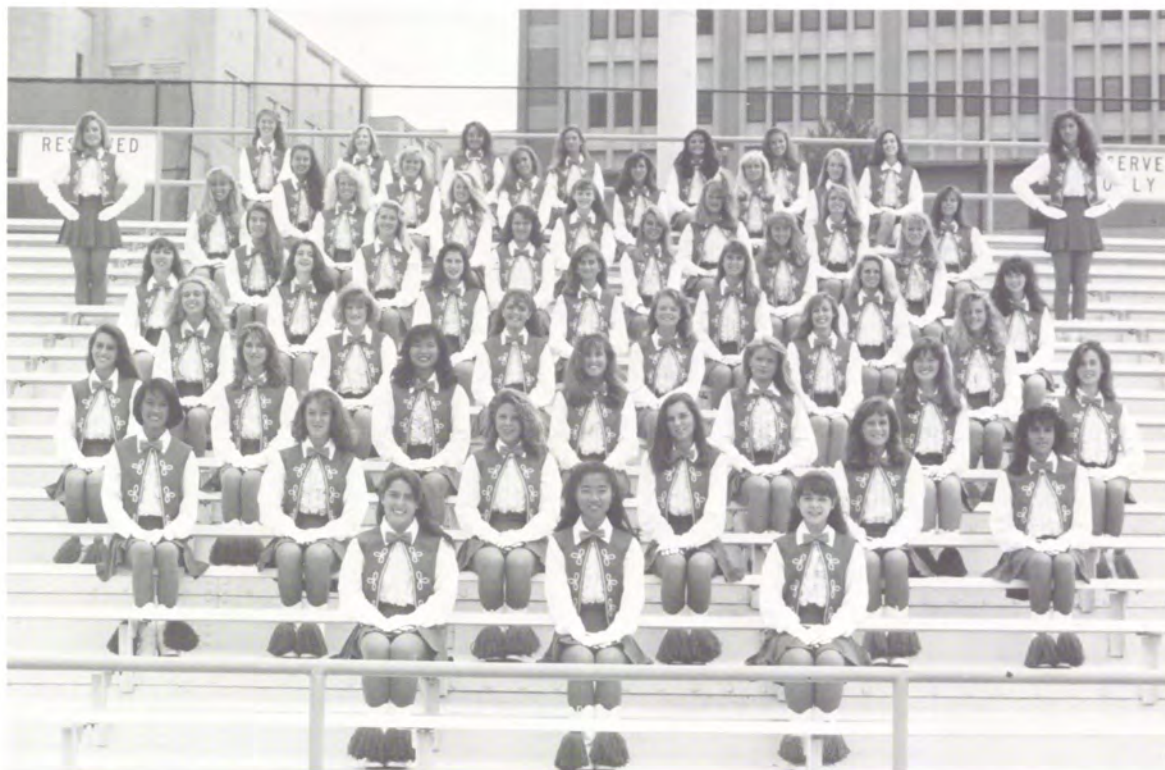


Rockettes and Silks add smiling faces to the show

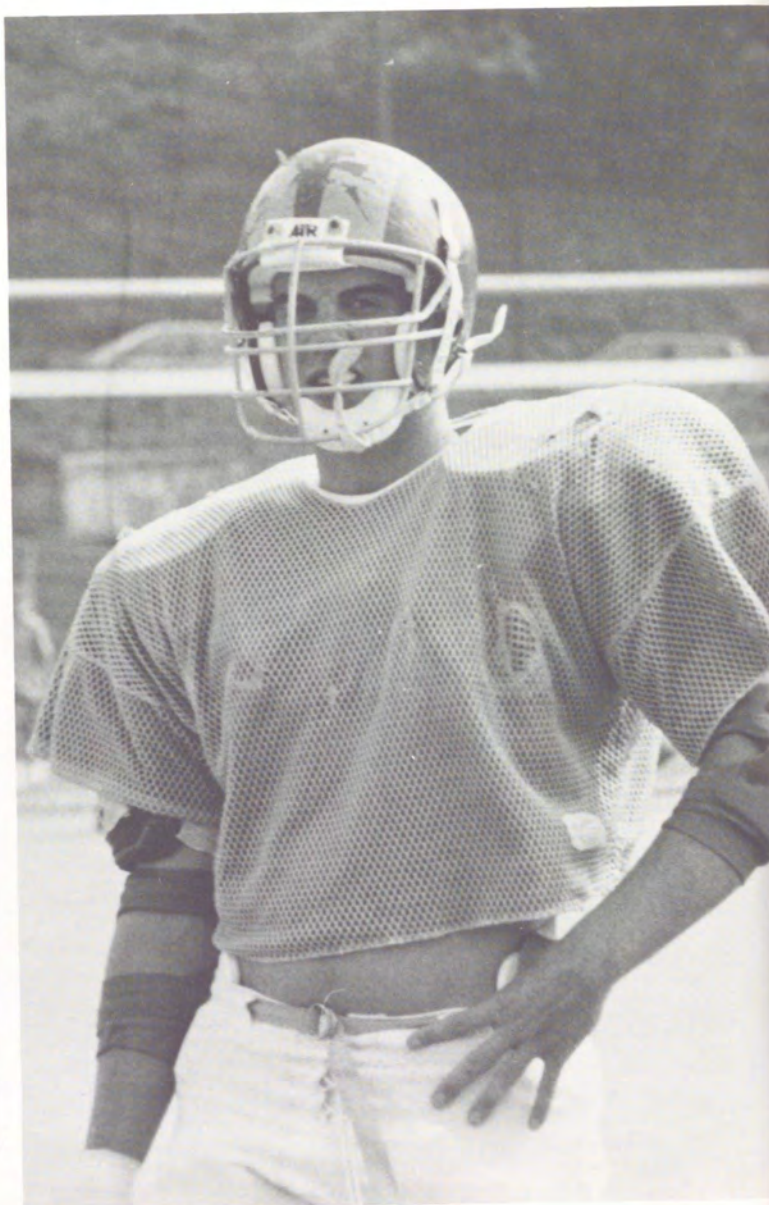

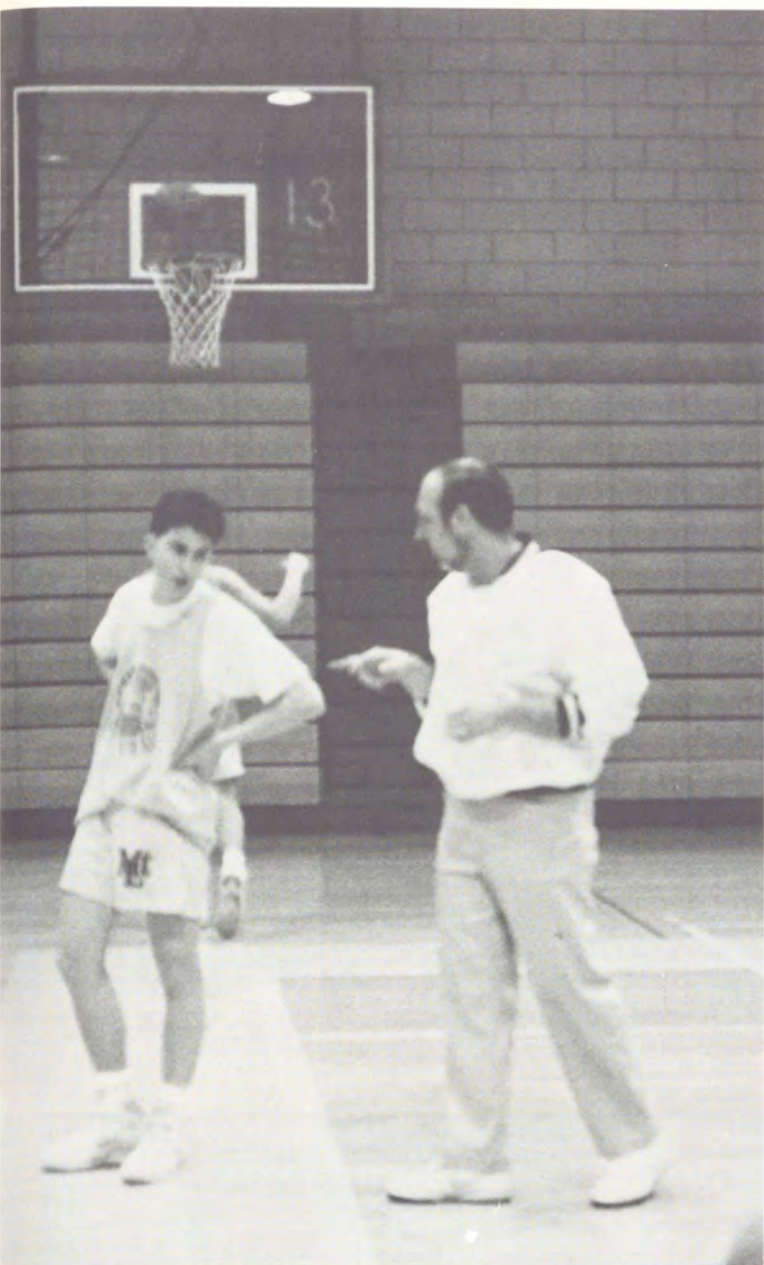

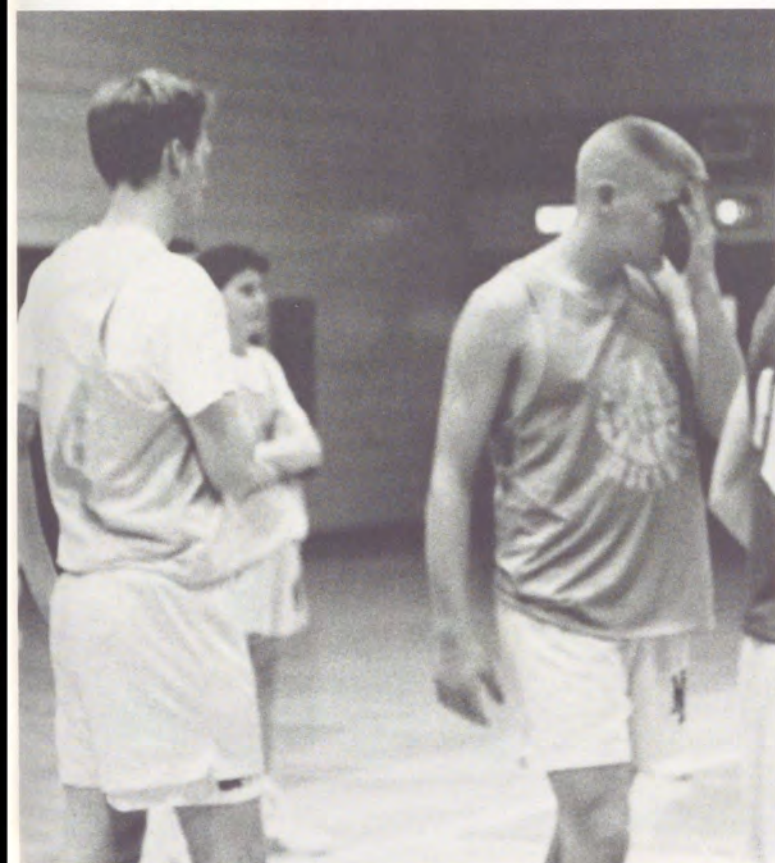

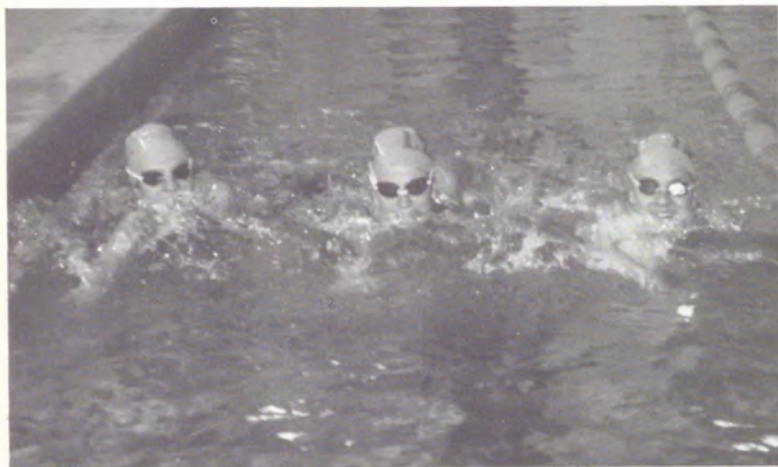
EDITORIALS

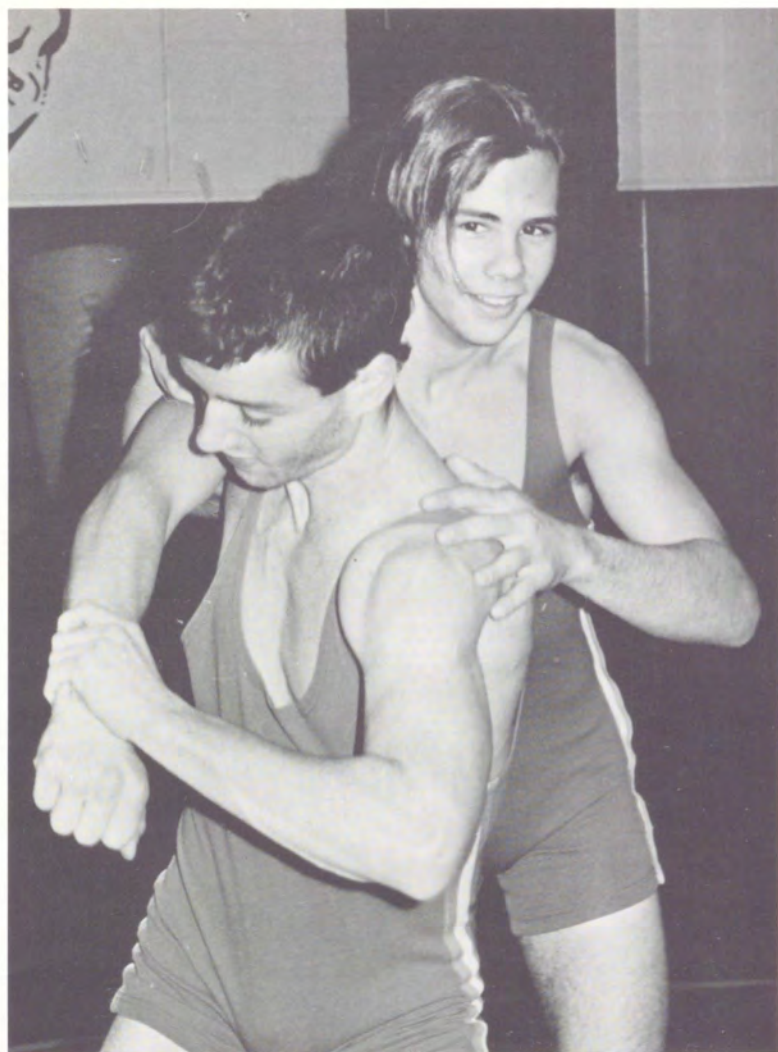

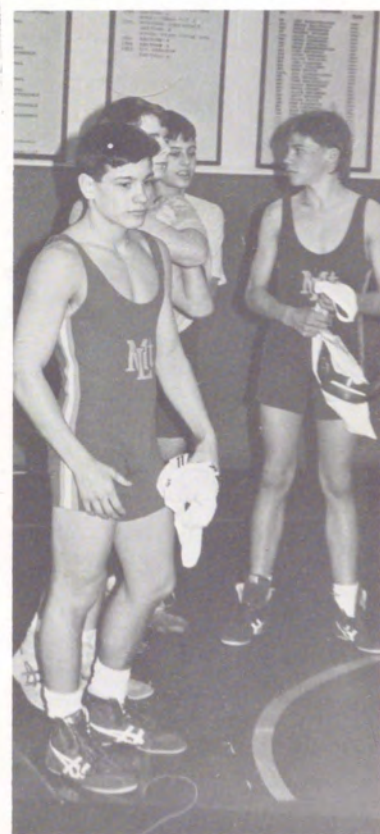

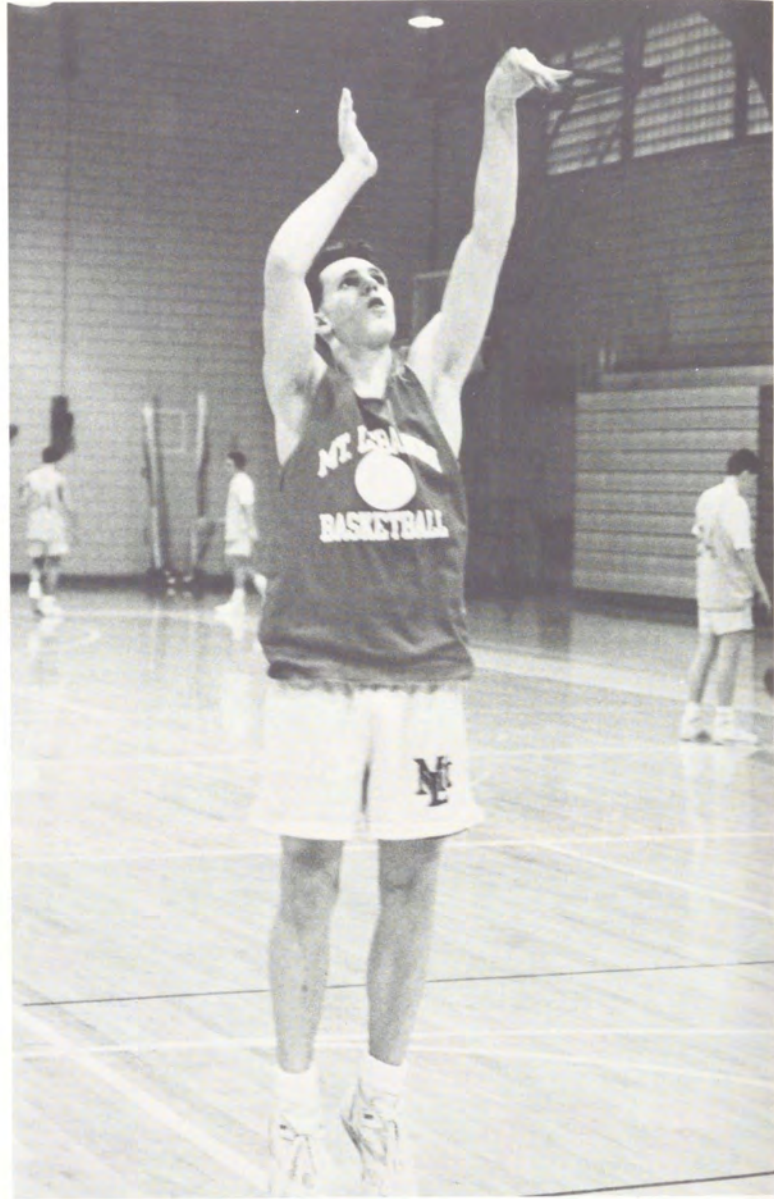

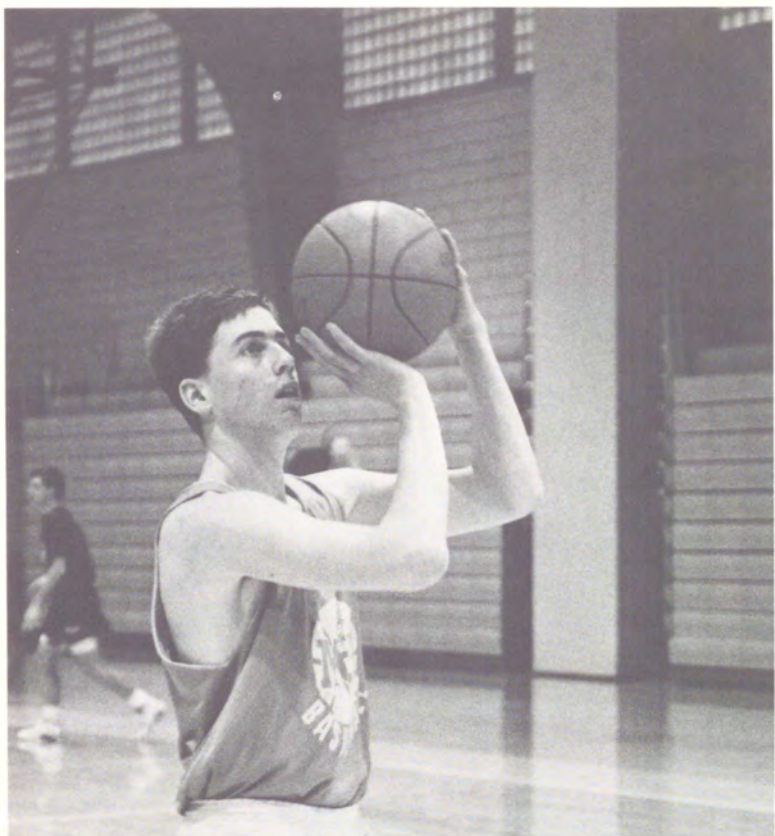

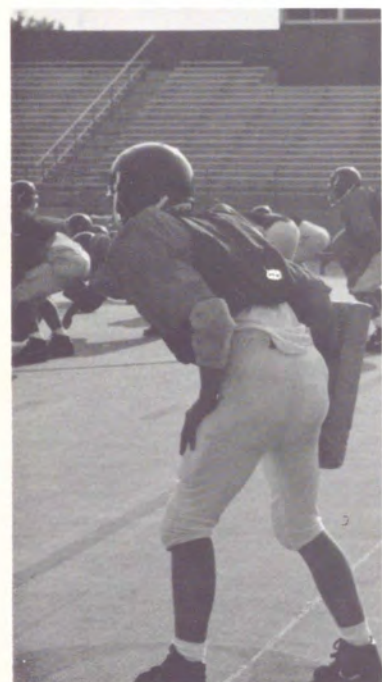
