










TRADITION Never Graduates!





Decorations at Homecoming featured a red carpet as you entered, Hollywood Hand prints of the Executive Council and silhouettes lining the windows of the fourth floor.






What's so fun about FORMALS?





THE WINNER IS. . . ?



Bringing It Back!











































With 176 different courses to choose from, Lebo students are faced with a mind-boggling dilemma. Students must meet graduation requirements including 43 credits in 8 specific areas: English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, Arts/Humanities, Health, Physical Education and Electives. In selecting courses, students must also consider which courses appeal to their specific interests. This becomes even more challenging when, due to the demands of industry and society, new courses are added to the Course Selection Guide. For the first time students are able to enroll in courses such as Japanese 1 and Media Literacy. In addition, courses such as Financial Accounting are revamped to incorporate new software and offer students college credit. The quest to earn college credits while still in high school is a motivating factor for many students when planning a schedule for the upcoming year. With 14 AP courses and numerous classes where college credit is granted upon successful completion of the course, students are provided with even more options. And if all of these considerations **made you think** before you even took the course, then just think what the course itself will make you do!




Baby Think It Over





New Taylor software, Elite Vision, allowed for greater flexibility in design and font selection, including X-Files and Angelica in the Student Life section, Youngstar in the Sports section, Ballardvale for captions and Jester for quotes. Enhanced photo quality was achieved through Ultra digital picture-perfect processing and the incredible shots captured by student photographers. Layouts became less traditional as they contained more feature stories, lead-ins and specially-designed pages, while still adhering to journalistic publication standards. Four color was used in 32 pages of the Senior section and in 16 pages of the Student Life section. The Sports section was highlighted with the spot colors Sapphire Blue14 and Gold90. Inserted after the last page, 232, is the Yearzine of current events from 2000-2001, followed by an eight page autograph section. The book is bound in 3/4 matte over gold and 1/4 sapphire blue with mylar laminate over four color photographs.
