



SUMMER IN A BUBBLE



DRESSIN' UP




















ACTIN' OUT

For the small hobbit, Bilbo Baggins, adventures were the last thing he ever wanted to undertake. When the famous wizard Gandalf pays a visit, however, and later the dwarves he invites begin flooding Bilbo's home, the poor hobbit unexpectedly finds himself agreeing to join them on their quest to reclaim their treasure from the evil dragon, Smaug.

Thus starts the epic adventure enacted by the first semester Evening Theatre Company from November 13, 2002 through November 16, 2002 in the play by Patricia Gray, adapted from the work by J.R.R. Tolkien, *The Hobbit*. Along the way to the Misty Mountains, Bilbo, portrayed Pat Shaw and Kevin Bigger, realizes the truth in Gandalf's words, "You will find there is more to him than meets the eye." Even though the dwarves, led by Thorin Oakenshield, portrayed by Courtney Reed and Bethany Remely, constantly doubt the

wizard, played by Matt Freas and Evan Jenkins, they watch the seemingly pitiful Bilbo, the small hobbit, repeatedly surprise himself and the others. Bilbo discovers his formerly untapped abilities and courage while facing the challenges of the journey, including survival skills when supplies are lost, a robbery attempt on the fearsome trolls, an intense battle with viscous goblins, outsmarting the odd predator Gollum, escaping capture by elves, and finally, defeating the malicious Smaug.





HUCK OR YOU'RE NOTHIN'

Ultimate in 10 Simple Rules

1. *The Field* - A rectangular shape with endzones at each end. A regulation field is 70 yards by 40 yards, with endzones 25 yards deep.
2. *Initiate Play* - Each point begins with both teams lining up on the front of their respective endzone line. The defense throws ("pulls") the disc to the offense. A regulation game has 7 players per team.
3. *Scoring* - Each time a player catches a pass in the endzone they are attacking, that player's team scores a point. A standard game ends when one team reaches 15 points.
4. *Movement of the Disc* - The disc may be advanced in any direction by completing a pass to a teammate. Players may not run with the disc. The person with the disc ("thrower") has ten seconds to throw the disc. The defender guarding the thrower ("marker") counts out the stall count.
5. *Change of Possession* - When a pass is incomplete, the defense immediately takes possession of the disc and becomes the offense.
6. *Substitutions* - Players not in the game may replace players in the

game only after a score or during an injury timeout.

7. *Non-contact* - No physical contact is allowed between players. Picks and screens are also prohibited. A foul occurs when contact is made, unless the contact is incidental.
8. *Fouls* - When a player initiates contact on another player, a foul occurs. If any foul should disrupt possession, the play resumes as if the possession were retained. If the player committing the foul disagrees with the foul call, the play is redone.
9. *Self-Refereeing* - Players are responsible for their own foul and line calls. Players resolve their own disputes.
10. *Spirit of the Game* - Ultimate stresses the spirit of sportsmanship and fair play. Competitive play is strongly encouraged, but never at the expense of respect between players, adherence to the rules, and the basic joy of play.









BREAKIN' A LEG





of mentor, cheerleader, guide, role model, and friend among countless others.

































