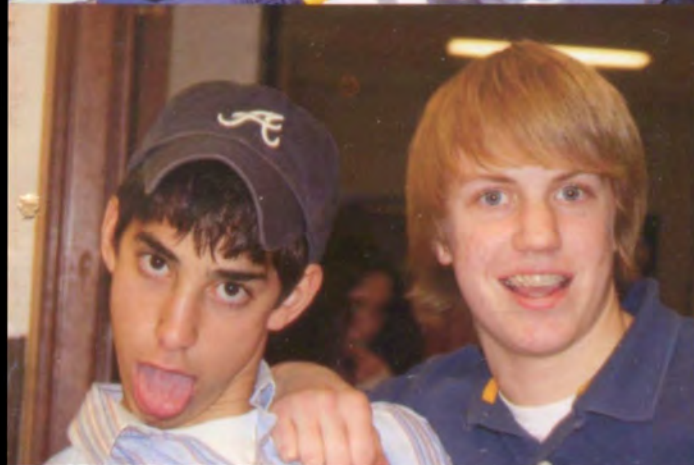

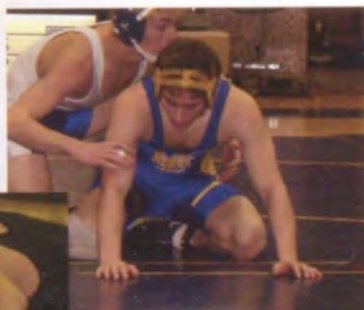

After losing in the WPIAL finals to Upper St. Clair last season, the boys basketball team returned for an even more successful season this year, culminating in their first WPIAL title since 1961. The season began in Central Mountain, PA, where Mt. Lebanon beat Frankfurt HS from Philadelphia to win the Central Mountain Tournament. They then won the Penn Hills Tournament and won at NA to conclude their preseason. The team then took their trip to Florida where they beat teams from Kentucky, Staten Island, and Florida to win the Daytona Beach Holiday Classic. After Florida, the boys returned to Pittsburgh to begin section play, ultimately earning a second place finish in the section to Bethel Park. The regular season was highlighted by wins at USC, ending their 40 plus home game winning streak, and then at home against USC on Senior Night. They went into the playoffs as the overall number two seed in the WPIAL and beat Hempfield, Shaler and Central Catholic to reach the finals at the Peterson Events Center against McKeesport. Though down for most of the game, the Blue Devils used a fourth quarter comeback to win the school's first championship in 45 years, outscoring McKeesport 56-46. The boys graduate four seniors, but have a strong group of underclassmen returning next year who hope to repeat this year's success.

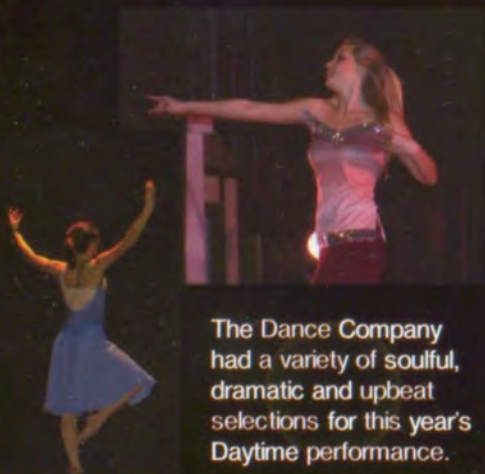
Dance Company

Some Word's of Wisdom From "the man"

Chelsea Garber, Senior: There have been a great deal of changes made to the high school this past year. Why were these changes made, why now?

Dr. J: I think we've been having some problems with the use of iPods and other electronic things in class. In the past, a teacher spots a kid with it in the hall and then you have to go through that whole process of taking it. We were just having too many incidents a year.

CG: If a student wanted to work with you on that, what would they do?

Dr. J: I've already put some of that into the works right now. I'm working with Student Council to get something together on that. We're trying to see if we can put iPod use during school in the AO and they're working out the details of that right now. If that works, we can move from there.

CG: What do you think about the issue of Mt. Lebanon in the media?

Dr. J: I think the newspapers and publications don't give us enough credit; we have a lot of great things going on here, but none of that seems to be noticed. I think that needs to change, and I think a lot of that change is attributed to the students.

CG: What is your favorite band?

Dr. J: Like new music or more of the retro stuff?

CG: Go retro for me, we'll try that first.

Dr. J: Well, I used to like Areo Speed wagon, and I saw the Steve Miller Band over the summer.

CG: I was at that concert, wow.

Dr. J: You're not going to print that right?

A chat with the new "super" of our high school

Chelsea Garber, Senior: Name some differences between your job a few years ago (working as an English teacher and then supervisor) and your work with us today.

Dr. Wilson: It had a narrower focus. Instead of a 6th through 12th curriculum, it is now a K through 12th.

CG: Something that some students have noticed is that you are not as visible as our last superintendent. Is that a conscious decision?

Dr. W: I don't see it as much as a lack of recognition as much as a lack of interest in show. I don't believe the students want to see me that often. I like to attend sports games and jog in the area. If the students are looking for me they can see me, although I doubt they would want to see me after jogging.

CG: What do you believe is the greatest asset of Mt. Lebanon High School?

Dr. W: I believe it's in the strength of the students. The power in the infrastructure is also important: the parents, the students, the teachers. You get a sense here that the students are purposeful in their education and expect good instruction. They don't let things go; they really want to contribute to their education.

CG: What would you change about Mt. Lebanon?

Dr. W: We need more recognition academically. Something I am trying to change right now is the amount of external validation the school receives. Ninety percent of our students are college bound and we were ranked #1 in Pittsburgh Business Times; not enough people know that about us.

CG: One last question. Since you were an English teacher, what is your favorite book?

Dr. W: Wow. That's a tough one. I think it would have to be The Great Gatsby, I liked to teach it.

Scientists discover soft tissue, including blood vessels and cells, in a 70-million-year-old fossilized **Tyrannosaurus Rex** thigh bone.

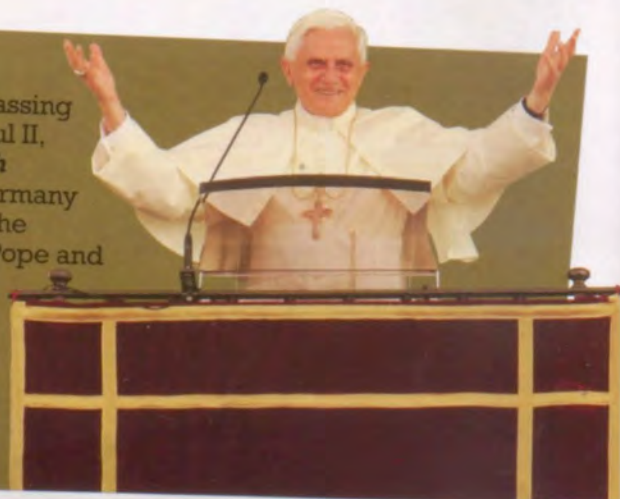


NOT GUILTY!

President Bush's ranch in Crawford, TX. Sheehan is the mother of the late US Army Specialist Casey Sheehan, who was killed in combat in Iraq. "Camp Casey" draws hundreds of supporters and lasts for almost four weeks.

Sheehan followed her protest with a three-week bus tour to Washington, DC, where a rally of over 100,000 people marched in protest of the war in Iraq.



TERRI SCHIAVO

Terri Schiavo's husband, Michael, squares off against his in-laws, the Bush administration, and thousands of protesters to **remove his wife's feeding tube**. After her death, Terri's autopsy confirms her doctors' prognosis that the **vegetative state** in which she had lived for fifteen years was irreversible.

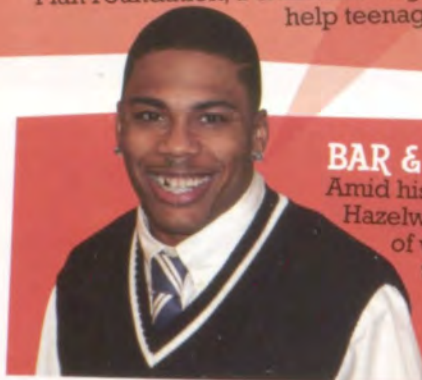


BAND WITH A PLAN Canadian power-pop rockers *Simple Plan* launch The Simple Plan Foundation, a charitable organization to help teenagers in need.
