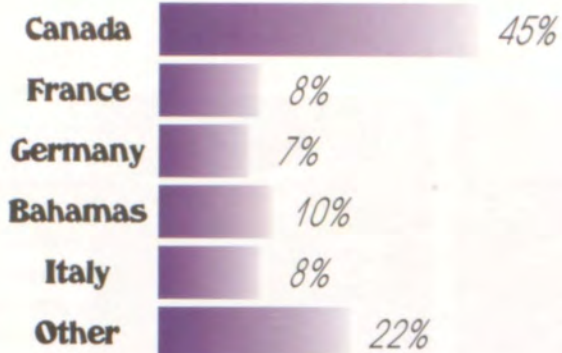

Maybe next time I'll just take a water break.

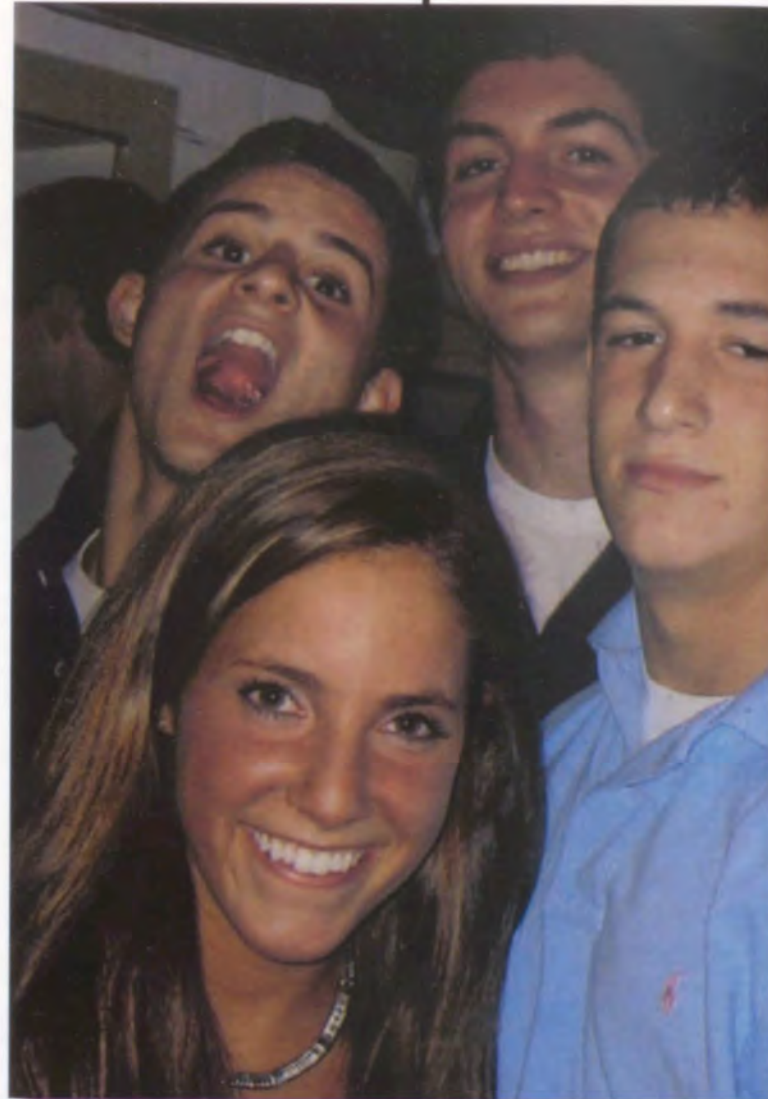

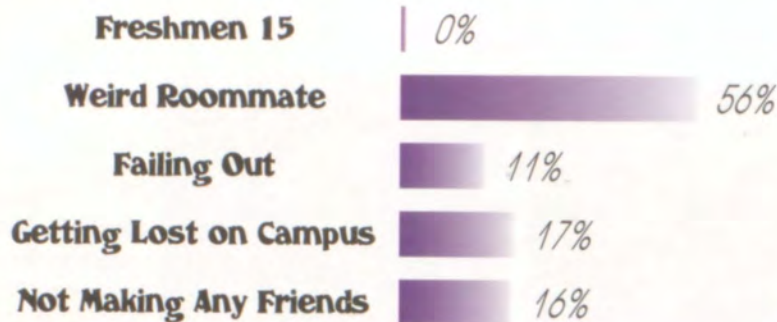

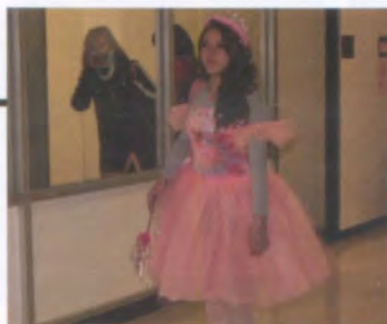

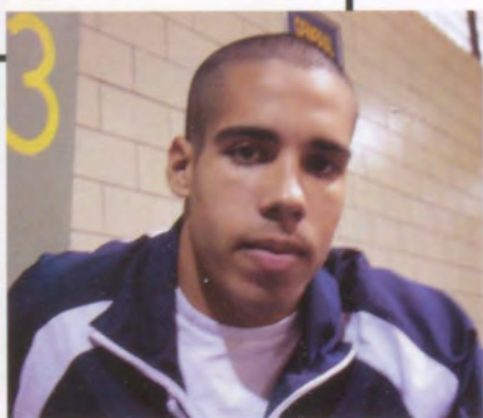
Henna: The Temporary Alternative

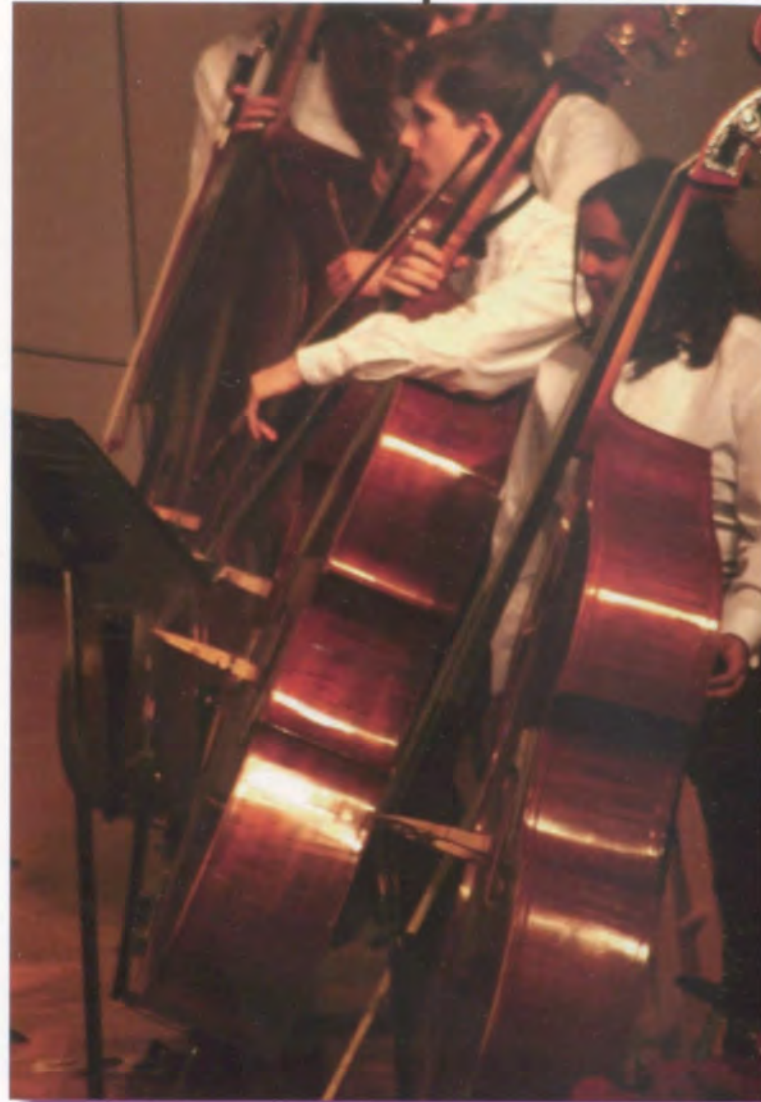

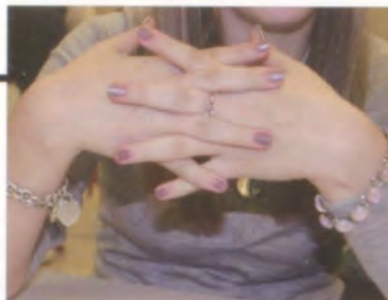

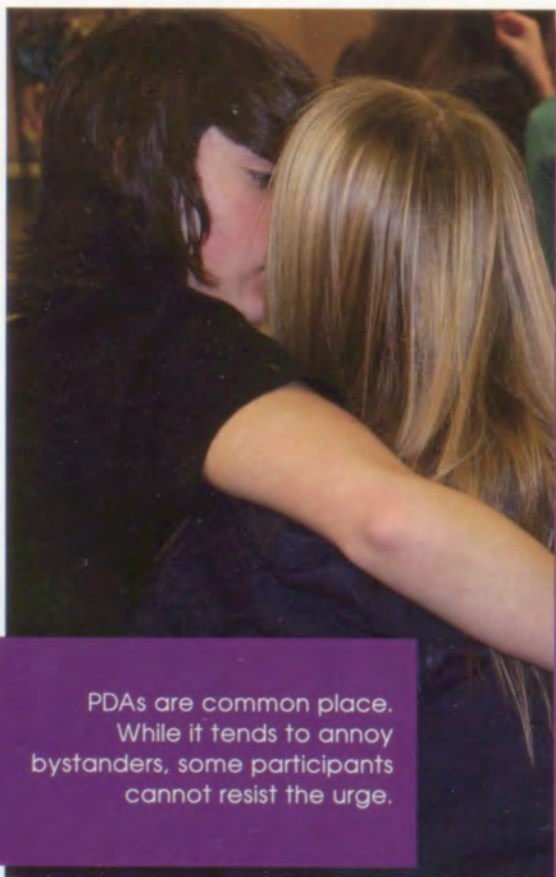

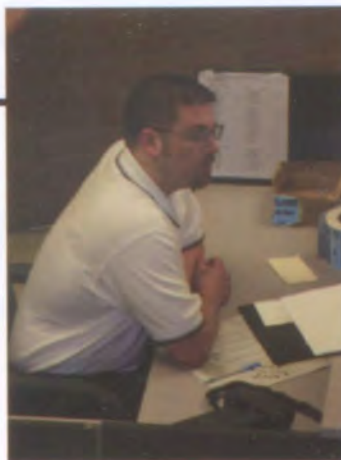

After removing that make-up and reapplying, I put on the

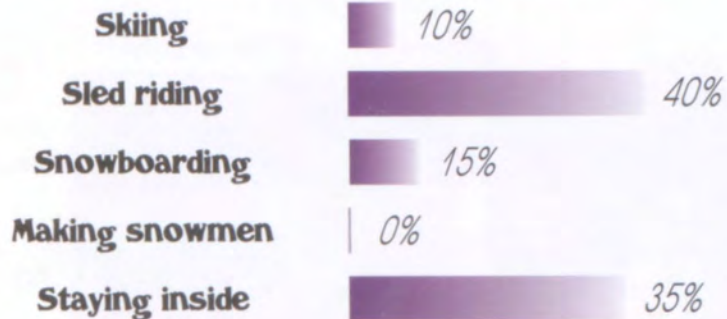
other finishing touches and was ready for pictures. I opened a liter of raspberry ginger ale to get a drink for my friend, Mere, and it exploded.

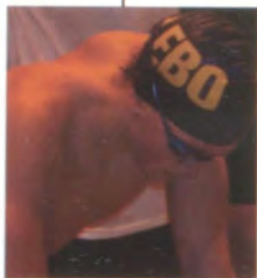

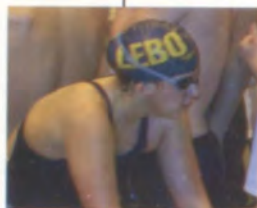

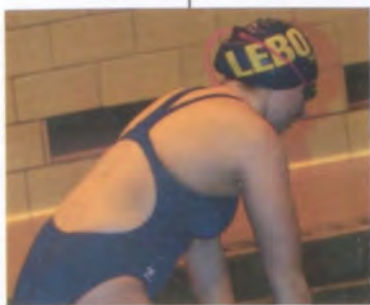

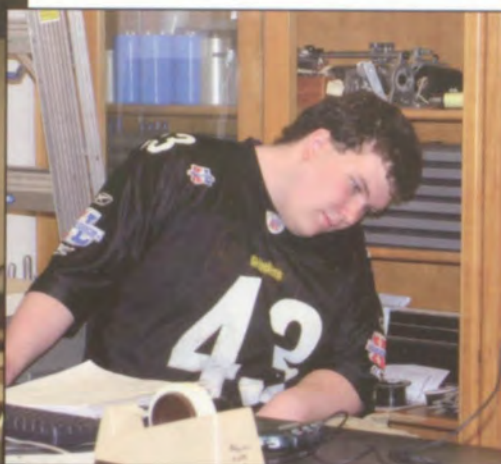

Unlike most other science courses, AP Physics does not have a specific lab day scheduled into the course each week. Instead, there are approximately five labs over the entire year.

Also, unlike many of the labs in other science courses, there is no set design for the labs. Instead, Mr. Ober has several different topics, like mass, in a broader category, such as air resistance or power, that will be explored.

Each group of three to four gets to choose one of the topics and design their own experiment. Unfortunately, some of the designs produce more accurate data and it is often difficult to determine if one's procedure will result in points taken off for poorly collected data.

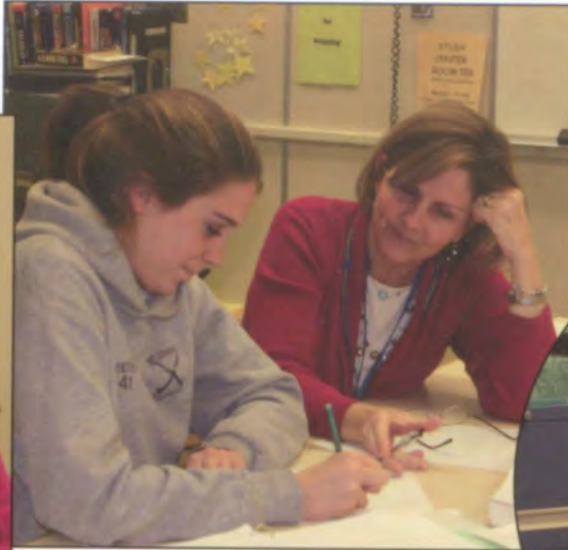

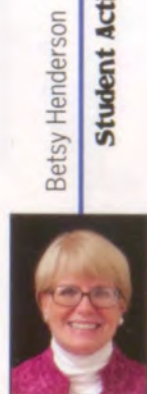
