











## TV Production Highlights











Rachel Welsh was a really good defender who experienced tremendous growth.


Alex Ventrone was strong in the center position and "Chickie" Brandy was a fast forward who ended up scoring the final goal








Kobelak also noted that the Smith sisters' performance of *Wicked* was especially interesting as the two were actually sisters, effectively paralleling real life as well as the musical.






## Being Green
