The S.S. Cut

Math, especially algebra, can torment the mind. After applying the same formula in hundreds of problems, the average student is ready to burn his math book.

One of the most infamous and feared equations that afflicts many students is the quadratic equation.

There is light at the end of the tunnel, however, due to a revolutionary new breakthrough: the S.S. Cut method. Here's a demonstration:

The problem: $3x^2 + 4x - 6$

Using the quadratic equation, we get:

$$\begin{array}{l} -4 \pm \sqrt{(16 - 4 * 3 * -6) \frac{1}{2}} \\ 6 \\ -4 \pm \sqrt{(88) \frac{1}{2}} \\ 6 \\ -4 \pm \sqrt{9.3808315} \\ 6 \end{array}$$

Which gives us the roots:

$$x = .8968 \text{ and } x = -2.230$$

Using the S.S. Cut technique, we skip the work:

$$\begin{array}{ll} 4 & 4 \\ 4 * 2 = 8 & 4 / 2 = 2 \\ 3 \ 9 & 4 / 2 = 2 \\ 3 * 2 = 6 & 3 \\ 4 * 2 = 8 & 6 - 6 = 0 \end{array}$$

$$x = .8968 \text{ and } x = -2.230$$

No mess, No square roots! Here's how:

FIRST ROOT

1. Look at the coefficient of middle term. This will tell you how many digits are in your answers.
2. Multiply the middle term by two. This gives you the first and last numbers in the first root.
3. The square of the first term is your second digit.
4. The first coefficient times two is your third digit.
5. Repeat steps 3 and 4 until the rule in the first step has been met.

SECOND ROOT

1. See Step 1 above
2. Look at the coefficient of the middle term. If it is even, the second root is negative.
3. The first two digits are your middle coefficient divided in half.
4. The first coefficient is your third digit.
5. Your fourth digit is the third coefficient minus six.
6. Repeat steps 4 and 5 until you have the required number of digits.

Easy! Amaze your friends by doing tough problems in your head! Once you have memorized these simple steps, you can forget about square roots, work faster, increase your accuracy, and spend your time in ways other than doing math problems. S.S. Cut is clearly the way to go.

Animal Farm by George Orwell

This remarkable book has been described in many ways- as a masterpiece . . . a fairy story . . . a brilliant satire . . . a frightening view of the future . . . and better than ham salad.

A crushing attack on the pig-headed, obese, and avaricious pigs ruling in an imaginary totalitarian state, it depicts the range of human experience from love to hate, beef to pork. This novel is best summed up by the quotation, "It's cured my craving for bacon!"

A good read, it kept me on the edge of my seat and away from bacon. Don't miss this one: you'll see pigs in an entirely new light.

The Bridge of San Luis Rey by Thornton Wilder

This funky, upbeat novel can be called Wilder's claim to fame in the jungle of American literature. This fantastic work, which won the Pulitzer Prize in 1938, demonstrates that nothing beats a good action thriller. The telling of the story of the five who fell from the bridge 200 years ago, is handled by a novelist so good he can confuse even the wisest of English teachers with his themes, imagery, and existential ideas.

Though I don't recommend the book, having the hardcover edition on your bookshelf will give you the appearance of being learned and cultured.

Cry, the Beloved Country by Alan Paton

The compassionate story of pastor Stephen Kumalo and his son Absalom, *Cry, the Beloved Country* has the makings of a fantastic tragedy. Sadly, the book lacks enough of the melodrama necessary to make it truly poignant.

This hasn't mattered, however, since English scholars have incorrectly assumed it is a piece of fine literature rather than a failed attempt at tragedy. These "scholars" have dissected the book so carefully that they have found themes that Paton had no idea he had included in his novel.

Despite its shortcomings, the book is a touching story. Be careful not to get caught up in the "supposed" themes hidden in the book. My advice: take it at face value and you can do no wrong.

Of Mice and Men by John Steinbeck

Travelling across America in search of rabbits, this book is one of the few works of fine literature that is ideal for the student. It is short, easy to read, not boring, compatible with one Mr. Cliff, and easily interpreted and understood. Not only that, but for a student in a rush, the book can be found in both VHS and Beta. No home is complete without a copy, so get yours today.

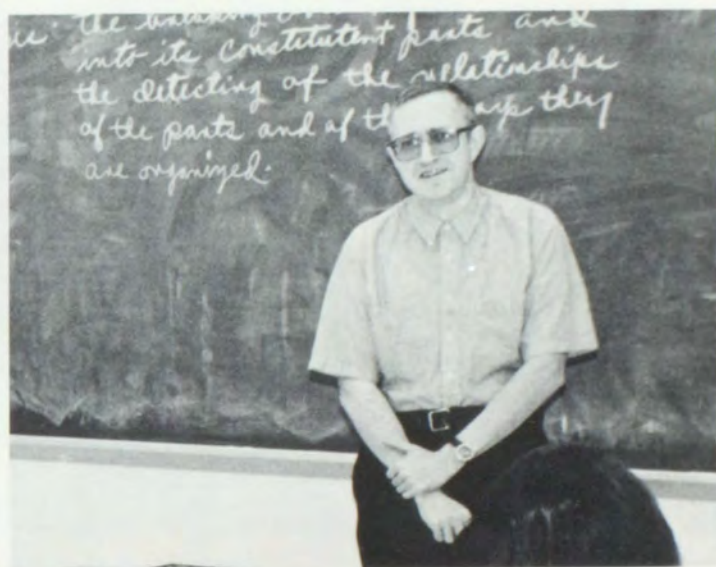

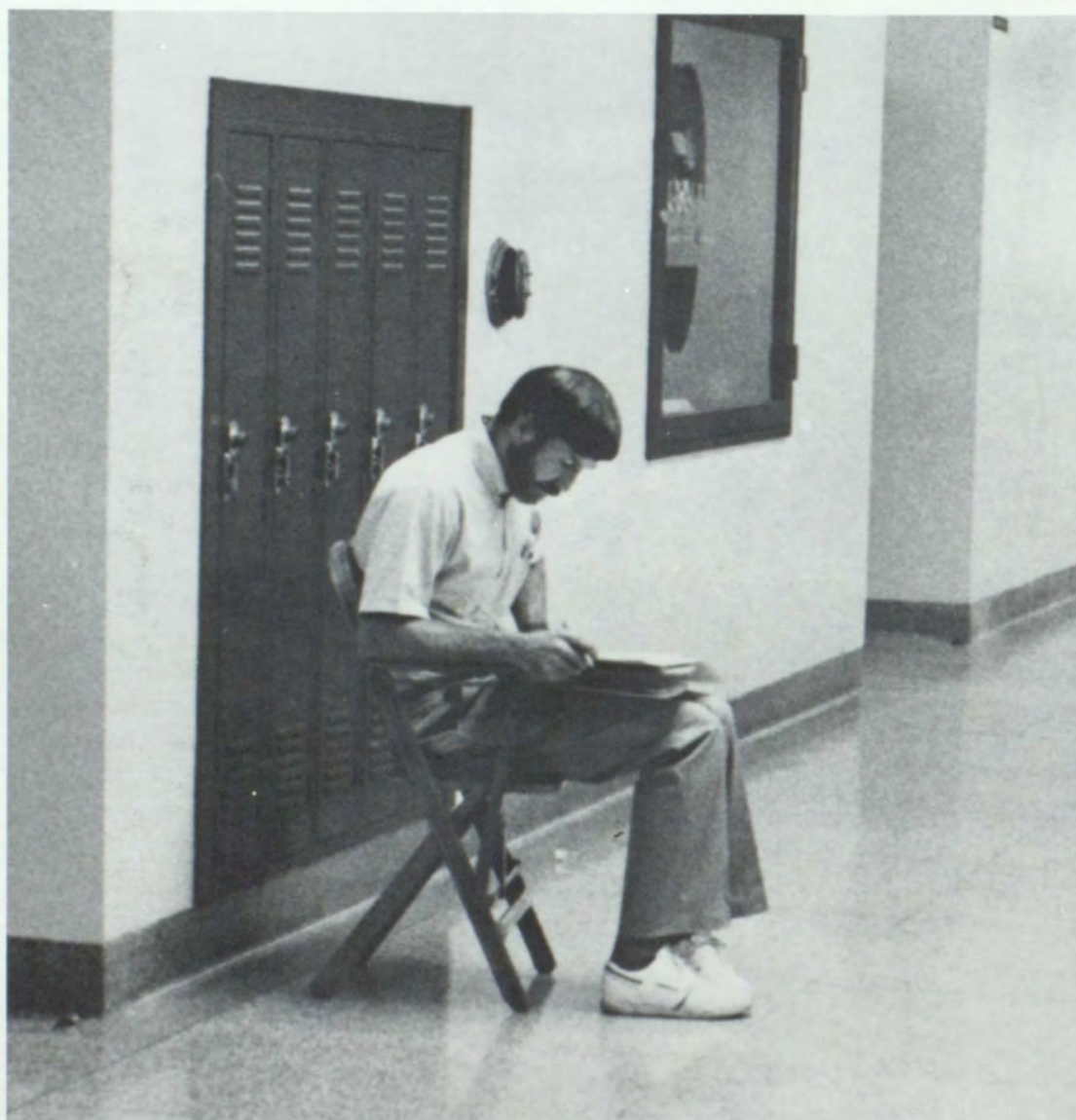

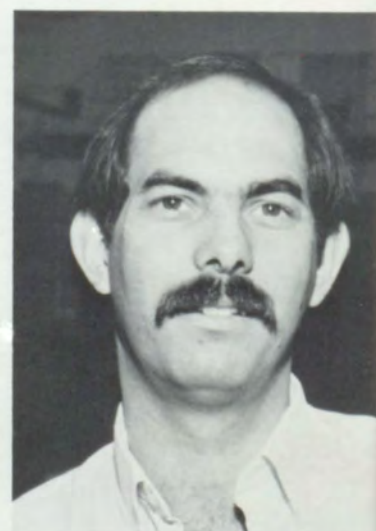

Oldies But Goodies

If Trees Could Talk

1912

"Neath cedars stately, midst hills so bold, stands our Mt. Lebanon, realm of blue and gold" begins our alma mater. Those cedars have been standing over us for over seventy-five years. They haven't always had so much to watch. As far back as 1794, over one hundred years before Mt. Lebanon officially became a township, children from this area went to school in a one room schoolhouse on the Odadiah Higbee farm (near the Mt. Lebanon park). That school building was the oldest school west of the Alleghanies until 1960 when deterioration unfortunately made its razing necessary. In 1885, due to population growth a bigger school was opened. That school was called the Academy. It stood on the corner of Washington Road and Academy Avenue. In the 1870's, after the Civil War, the Academy was closed and two new one room school houses opened. These schools were built under the direction of Scott Township, which encompassed Mt. Lebanon at that time. One school stood behind the Mt. Lebanon United Presbyterian Church and the other stood at the corner of Washington Road and Sunnyhill Drive. One teacher taught all eight grades in each these schools. (continued on the next page)

The next school built was the Anman Avenue school which was a four room white frame school house. While it was being constructed, classes were taught in the home of William Bell. At first there were only enough pupils to fill two of the rooms. At the same time period there was also a one room schoolhouse on Beadling. These schools only taught grades one through six. Seventh and eighth graders went to the Lee School in Beechview. In July 1912, the Mt. Lebanon School District was formally founded and the first school board appointed. The 1912 board started Mt. Lebanon's tradition of looking for progressive and practical ways to improve. They started by eliminating all homework and tests. They also created a senior high which let the students grow a garden on Bower Hill Road to learn about forestry and agriculture. In recent years Mt. Lebanon has continued to try and find progressive ways to

change the school. During the late '70's and early '80's they tried a diagonal schedule and one year final exams were eliminated all together. The experimental school approach in the early teens only lasted three years until a new board was elected, and Mt. Lebanon went back to more traditional teaching methods.

The real growth and expansion of the Mt. Lebanon school system started happening in the twenties. In 1919 the school board bought the plot of land that would later become the Washington School. From the time Washington opened in 1923, Mt. Lebanon has been growing steadily. The high school was built in 1931. Additions were added in 1957 and 1972. In the years 1923-1965, Mt. Lebanon built a total of seven elementary schools, two junior highs and the afore mentioned high school. Over the past two decades, enrollment has dropped, and both junior high schools were closed. Now

all seventh and eighth graders occupy the top floor of the senior high. Although Mt. Lebanon has stopped growing physically, at least for right now, it continues to grow intellectually. We are the first class with new graduation requirements. Mt. Lebanon's strong academic background has always prepared its students well for college. Even in the aftermath of the depression, Mt. Lebanon had forty-five percent of its students going on to college. Today that number has almost doubled with eighty five percent of all current graduates going on to higher education. Those Cedars of Lebanon have been watching over us for a long time now. As they continue to watch Mt. Lebanon's traditions grow, the class of 2001 will enter first grade next year. The school district, its people, and this high school will continue into the twenty-first century.

SPORTS

"Win! We can! Here we

go again! Rah! Rah! Rah! Rah! Mt. Lebo High!" shout the cheerleaders and marching band at every high school football game. When they say again they really mean again! Mt. Lebanon has a long tradition of winning sports teams. With twenty-three varsity teams in fourteen different sports, Mt. Lebanon has won over one hundred district and state championships. Many of the varsity teams have shared the glory through the years. In a span of twenty-one years (1944-63) the track team won sixty-two WPIAL and three state titles under the leadership of coach Don Mollenauer. The team had a record of 144 consecutive wins in dual and triangular meets. Mollenauer also coached the incredible fourteen WPIAL wins and eleven state championships of the boys cross-country team. Swimming too has won numerous WPIAL championships. In 1960, the team won WPIALS, states and an Eastern

United States title. In the early sixties Mt. Lebanon swimmer Tom Tretheway set six national high school records. In 1964 he competed in the Olympics in Tokyo. One time Lebo diver Dick Rydze went to the 1972 Olympics and brought home a silver medal. The tennis team started winning traditions back as far as the thirties. They won matches against Kiski, Shadyside Prep, and many other schools which would someday become WPIAL. They also sent many top players to ivy league tennis teams.

Since the formation of the WPIAL league boys tennis has picked up thirteen championships. The girls team has also gotten into the action in recent years. Our wrestlers have grabbed seven WPIAL championships ('65, '68, and '78 to name a few). 1987 alum Kurt Angle is presently training for the 1992 Olympics. The boys basketball and baseball teams have also contributed to the WPIAL wins for Mt. Lebo with one a piece. Our rifle team, which is

co-ed, has four WPIAL championships in its holsters. Then of course there is the Blue Devil football team. In the early years the "Mounties" (a name which many Lebo teams answered to) had a tough time winning a game let alone a WPIAL title. In 1955, the team finally it to their first playoff game, but it took until 1966 for the Lebos (another name the Blue Devils have answered to over the years) to finally win a WPIAL championship. Since then the Blue Devils have collected five more WPIAL titles. Lebo football has sent its fair share of athletes to the pros. In 1939 Lebo alum Bill Davidson set the Steeler punt return record which remained intact until 1985. Star pass receiver for the San Francisco 49ers, John Frank, is also a Lebo graduate. Mt. Lebanon's four time WPIAL soccer champs have also sent players to the pros. John O'Hara, former captain of the recently disbanded Spirit, is a Lebo Alumnus. The Lebo sports tradition is

carrying on right now and will surely not end here. We may have the next Dick Rydze or John Frank in our halls and on our playing fields today. This is only a small portion of the strong Lebo sports tradition. "Win! We can! Here we go AGAIN!"

ACTIVITIES

Each year in center court there is activities day. Every year it seems like the same old crop of clubs, but it hasn't always been this way. through the years Mtl. has had such interesting clubs as the Display Case Squad the Cafeteria Dispatchers and the Bridge Club.

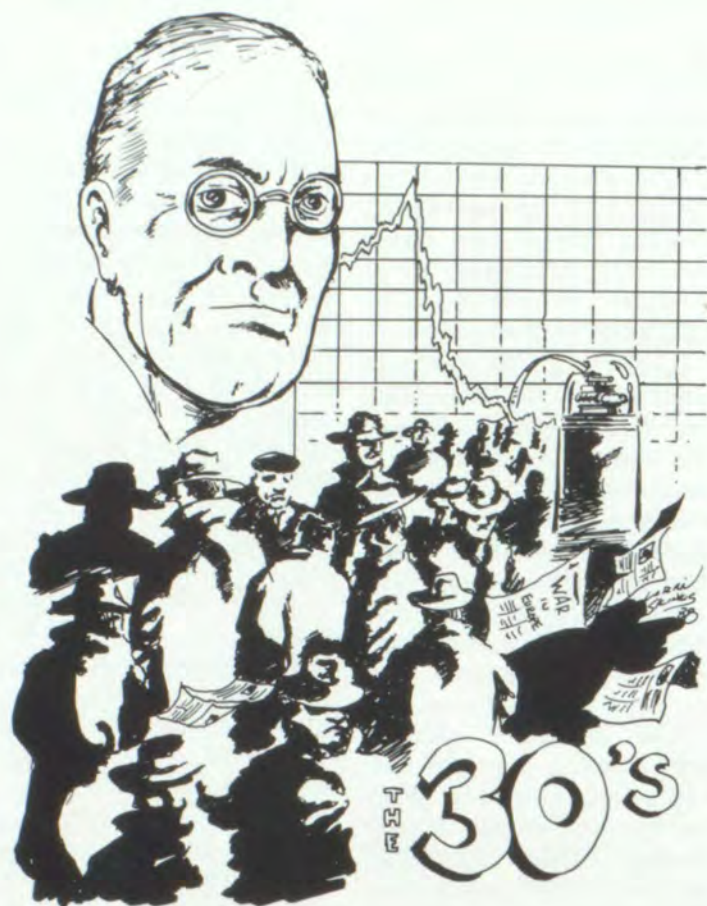
Through The Years

Although the 1930's are an era commonly remembered for the great depression and the rise of facism in Europe, many people tried to retain an optomistic outlook on life and its activities. These were the years of the Zoot suit, the Jitterbug and the first bobby-soxers. High school students kept occupied with radio shows such as Amos 'n Andy and Myrt and Marge, while movies like The Wizard of Oz and Gone With the Wind stormed the theaters. Although there was not a lot of dating, a teen's social life never faltered. School sponsored "Sock-Hops" were popular. Here everyone went to the gym, removed their shoes and literally danced in their socks. People also went in groups to friends' houses and played a new and innovative game called Monopoly. Despite their attempts at optomism, however, these were harsh years. The first draft began, requiring all 18-year old males to register. Also during these years Pittsburgh experienced its worst national disaster. In 1936 the "big flood" occurred and halted Pittsburgh life. People travelled the city in small boats, and the Stanley Theater, now the Benedum Center, had a baby grand piano floating in its balcony. These years then, remembered for the adversities they presented were also filled with the natural joys and sorrows of life.

The 1940's is a time period best remembered for the Second World War. However, life here at home focused not on the distant struggle but on the

news at home. On December 7, 1941 a small article appeared in the Pittsburgh Press stating that a new innovative item would appear and with the flick of a switch would project an image simultaneously as events occurred. To some, this small development took precedence over the bombing of Pearl Harbor. These years were filled with the Andrews Sisters, radio shows, and movies with stars like Bob Hope, Bing Crosby, John Wayne and Errol Flynn. Although not focused on the war, the lives of all students were affected. Mt. Lebanon gave its valiant men to the war and lost many. Those at home, though, were not excluded, but participated in wartime activities like War bond and stamp drives, recycling centers and other volunteer services. Then in 1945, on August 6, the first atomic bomb was dropped and a new era began.



This era was the 1950's, a time remembered for the peace and prosperity it offered, but also for the continuation of the atomic saga begun in 1945. The Cold War began in the 1950's and atomic drills like "Duck and Cover" were practiced faithfully in schools. The fears of the 50's, atomic power and communism, were evident in the films of the time like *Them!* and *Invasion of the Body Snatchers*. However life was basically peaceful and prosperous. It was the age of the bobby-soxers, poodle skirts and greased back hair. Drive-in theaters became popular and rock 'n roll became a symbol for a generation with "Rock Around the Clock" by Pittsburgh natives Bill Haley and the Comets. Rock and Roll grew to massive proportions with the help of a young man from Memphis, Tennessee-- Elvis Presley. With the 50's came the birth of television and shows such

as *Howdy Doody* and *The Mickey Mouse Club*. The 1950's were a time of innocence, cornerstore malt shops, and the Edsel. These are times that will live forever through their music and memories.

The 1960's, however, were a time of inner turmoil. With the assassination of John F. Kennedy, America lost its innocence. American involvement in the Vietnam conflict was reaching its peak, and with this peak came revolutionary new movements. High school and college students alike became actively involved in peace and anti-nuclear rallies. Rallies also began for black rights, and Martin Luther King became a crusader for this cause; but not without the help of Rosa Parks, a tired Negro woman who sat at the front of a segregated bus at a time when blacks were separated from all aspects of white life. The 60's though are perhaps best known for its hippies



and its music. The 60's brought with them an invasion of British musicians, not the least of which was the Beatles. The Beatles, one of the most popular groups of all time lasted through the decade and saw many groups, such as The Byrds, the Mamas and the Papas, and the Beach Boys compete and succeed. Then, Woodstock, the hippies last hurrah, occurred drawing all the elements, music, lost innocence and the rallies to a close.

Finally, the 1970's moved in with a resounding echo. Vietnam was continuing in full force while Nixon and the Watergate scandal was under fierce scrutiny. The 70's brought with them a fierce womens liberation movement and "bra-burnings." Here women attempted to express their freedom and emancipation by publicly removing and burning their bras. As the years progressed bell-bottoms

became a popular fashion item, and John Travolta and disco moved into the lives of many teens. These were the years of the first shuttle launchings, a jubilant occasion, and the Iran hostage affair which lasted for 444 days and held many Americans away from home and family. Sesame Street and Mr. Rogers became increasingly popular, and films such as the blockbusters Jaws, Star Wars, Alien, Close Encounters of the Third Kind, and Animal House became an integral part of teenage social life. Then in 1979, Ronald Reagan became Presidential-elect, and the country and Mt. Lebanon moved into a new era.

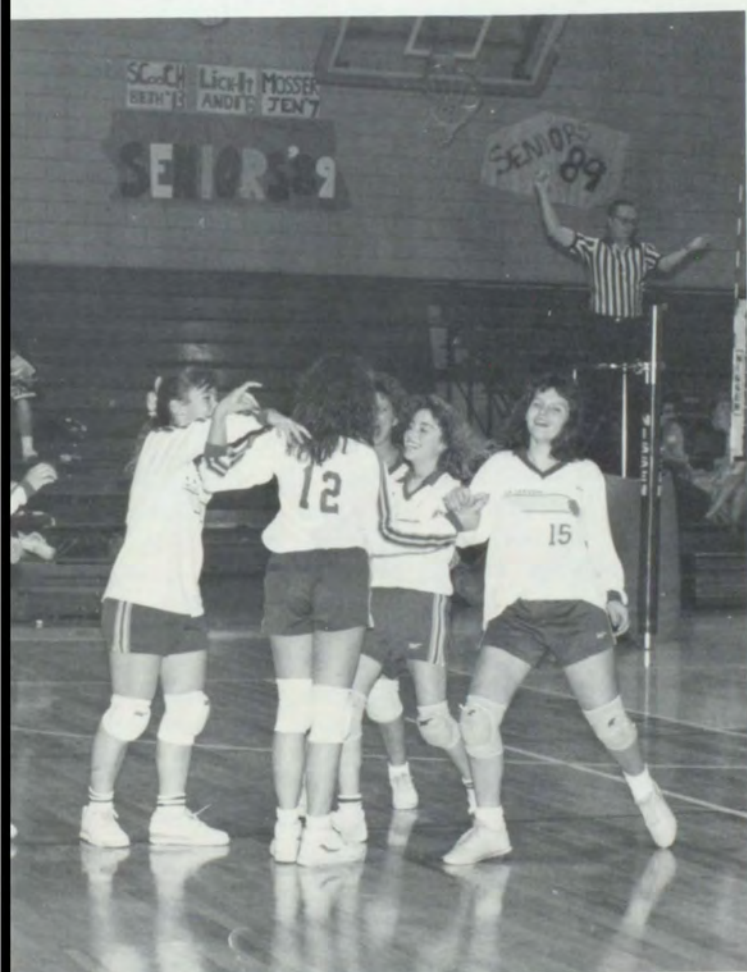

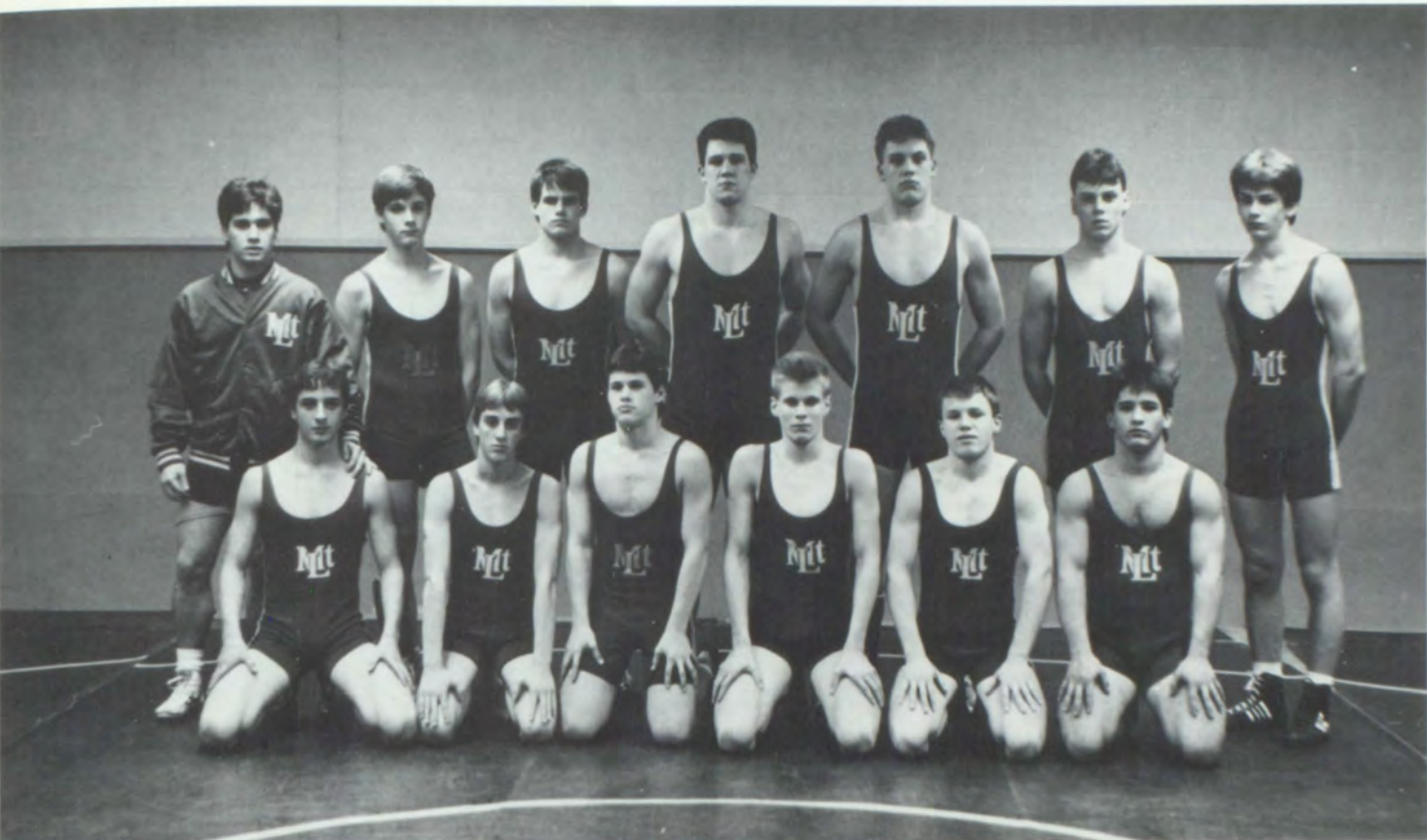
On the individual level, Mt. Lebanon had great results. This year's most outstanding wrestlers were the following: at 130

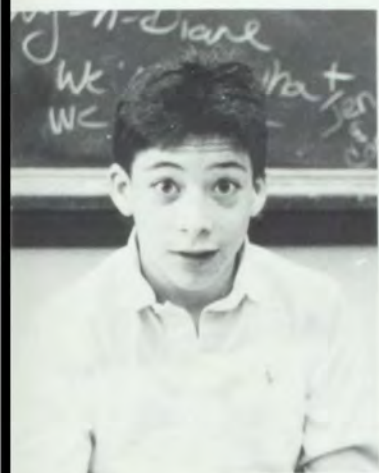




Rules For The Stress Diet

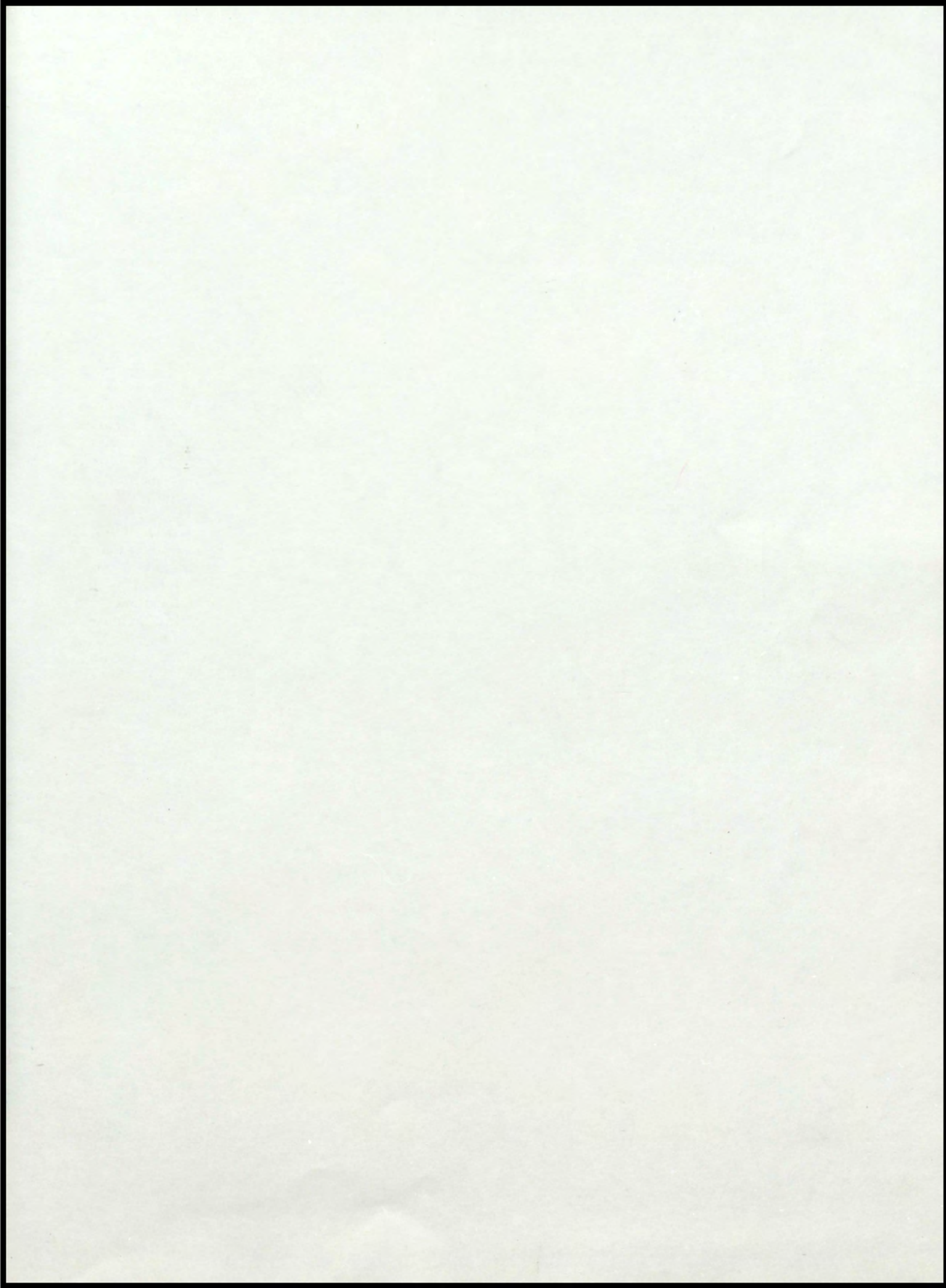
The Average Lebo Student
